### **Students Turn Sleuths**



The Tamil Nadu State Police Museum is a two-storied historical building that was on the brink of demolition but has now been beautifully restored. This restoration has breathed new life into the structure, allowing visitors to experience what it might have been like to live and work in this iconic building back in 1882.

Today, the museum showcases the evolution of the Tamil Nadu Police force, from its colonial roots to its modern, technologically advanced form. Visitors can view an array of exhibits, including mannequins dressed in historical and contemporary police uniforms, a collection of weapons ranging from the 303 rifles to the latest Bren light machine guns, and vintage police vehicles. Additionally, the museum features displays of notable police cases, swords, riot gear, cameras, explosives, and many other intriguing artifacts.

On 20<sup>th</sup> November, 2024, Grade 6 students had the opportunity to visit this fascinating museum. Guided tours provided them with insights into the development of the Tamil Nadu Police over the years. TIPS commitment to experiential learning is further strengthened through this visit. They explored photographs of significant police cases and learned about the rich history of law enforcement in the state.



# **Art Exploration**





Cholamandal Artists' Village, established in 1966, is celebrated as the largest artists' commune in India. Located in Injambakkam, this village played a pivotal role in the Madras Movement of Art (1950s–1980s), which introduced modernism to South Indian art. The artists of this community are renowned for their exceptional contributions to postwar Indian art, with their work showcased in galleries across India, Europe, the United States, and South America.

The students of Grade 7 visited this iconic art village, on 20<sup>th</sup> November, 2024, which provided a unique insight into various art forms, including sculptures and paintings. TIPS invigorates learners to explore places with cultural significance. It was an enriching and eye-opening experience that left the students inspired and deeply appreciative of the rich artistic heritage of India.



# A Step Back in Time



The Government Museum in Chennai, also known as the Madras Museum, is situated in Egmore and stands as a remarkable repository of human history and culture. Established in 1851, it is the second-oldest museum in India, following the Indian Museum in Kolkata. The museum is renowned for its extensive archaeological and numismatic collections and boasts the largest collection of Roman antiquities outside Europe. It is often regarded as one of the most richly endowed museums in Asia.

Among its notable features are the impressive Museum Theatre and the National Art Gallery, both located within the museum complex. Built in the stunning Indo-Saracenic architectural style, the museum houses rare European and Asian paintings by renowned artists, including masterpieces by Raja Ravi Varma. Additionally, it holds one of Asia's richest collections of bronze idols, with around 500 pieces dating back as far as 1000 BCE.

On November 21, 2024, the Grade 8 students had the opportunity to visit the Government Museum. This visit offered them a deeper understanding of Indian history and the histories of other civilizations. The commitment of TIPS to create global citizens with a sound knowledge of their cultural and historical background is reflected by this visit. The experience was truly enlightening, leaving the students in awe of the richness and antiquity of Indian civilization. The educational value of the trip left a lasting impression, making it an unforgettable experience for all who participated.
